Navajo Technical University has roots in the "Navajo Skills Center," established in 1979, to assist a largely unemployed population to develop work skills so that they could find jobs in and around the Navajo Nation. The Navajo Skills Center successfully provided workforce education and assisted the graduates with obtaining jobs. As the Skills Center became more effective, the students began requiring more academic and advanced training and education. Thus, the Board of Directors encouraged the development of an educational vision to meet those needs, and in 1985, the Crownpoint Institute of Technology was created as the first higher education institution focused on vocational and technology degrees on the Navajo Nation. This led to the successful development of associate of applied science degrees (AAS) that expanded the school's mission. No longer did the school only provide courses of study that led to professional or vocational certification, but it also offered degree programs. In 1994, the institution became part of the land grant system of colleges and universities in the United States. Then, in 2005, with another name change, Navajo Technical College (NTC) became a fully accredited institution of higher learning with the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Schools and Colleges. In 2012, the Navajo Technical College Board directed the administration to become a university. The Navajo Nation Council was approached twice before it approved the request in July 2013; the Higher Learning Commission gave its approval in fall 2013. The Navajo Nation's first university offers nine bachelor degree programs, the only master's degree in Diné Culture, Language and Leadership anywhere in the world, 17 associate degrees and 23 certificates. The University has three locations: Crownpoint, NM (main campus), Chinle, AZ and Teec Nos Pos, AZ.

The competition wins of NTU students continue to motivate NTU to strive for excellence. NTU has excelled in SkillsUSA competitions both at the state and at the national levels. SkillsUSA provides educational programs, events and competitions that support career and technical education through a partnership between education and industry. A total of 16 students won gold medals, 14 won silver medals and 2 students won bronze medals at the New Mexico SkillsUSA competitions held in Albuquerque, NM, in spring 2015. At the National level, DeAnna James, Brenda Joe and Raderick Brown were gold medal winners in the Career Pathways competition. These wins kept NTU at the forefront among all of the other public and private higher education institutions that compete in SkillsUSA. At the 2016 AIHEC student conference competition, students won in the following categories: Film Festival (Best Animation and Best Special Effects), Speech (Humorous) and Volleyball. Another highlight for NTU is a former 2015 graduate of NTU, Miss Rhonda Joe, was crowned the 2016-2017 Miss Navajo Nation. Rhonda is from Rock Point, AZ and was also Miss Navajo Technical University in 2013. This recognition is significant considering that Miss Navajo Nation embodies the Navajo culture, Language, and Traditions. As a role model, Miss Joe will serve as a Goodwill Ambassador for the Navajo Nation and embody the essence of the female Navajo Holy people: First Woman, White Shell Woman and Changing Woman.

Challenges Narrative

Please share one or two significant challenges faced by your institution in AY 2016 (e.g. faculty changes, natural disaster, funding cuts, etc.).

Although Navajo Technical University (NTU) has successfully increased its enrollment annually, the 2015-2016 academic year saw its first enrollment decline. The fall 2015 enrollment was 1686, a decrease from the previous fall enrollment of 2075. This is in agreement with reports by the National Student Clearinghouse Research Center of a 6.3% enrollment decrease from the previous year for NM degree granting institutions, and with a national enrollment decline of 1.3% from the prior year. This is the first reported enrollment decrease at NTU in the past seven years. Enrollment management, retention and recruitment efforts have been implemented to deter enrollment drops and to assist students in completing their respective programs.

NTU still has the need for additional classroom and dormitory space, and also for faculty and staff housing. The Crownpoint campus provides 31 family housing units and two dorms with 92 rooms but there is an annual wait list for this housing. Many faculty commute to NTU, several driving over 100 miles round-trip to teach at NTU in Crownpoint, NM. NTU provides 34 housing units, including 10 mobile homes, for faculty and staff but there is a wait list for this housing. Funding from the primary grant sources has been flat, even with slight decreases, in the past several years which limits the university's ability to renovate or construct new buildings. The main campus' aging buildings are difficult to upkeep. In Crownpoint, aside from low-rent housing, there is very little housing available for rent in the community. Lack of housing for students, faculty and staff is still a critical need.

The students in Chinle, AZ, continue to express desire to enroll in the four-year programs but the programs have not been extended there pending acquisition of new facilities. After years of trying, NTU acquired land in

Did the institution experience an increase or a decrease in enrollment of 10% or more between fall 2014 and fall 2015? If so, please explain why.

Yes, NTU's enrollment decreased by 18% from the previous semester. Fall 2014 had an enrollment of 2075 while fall 2015 had a lowered enrollment of 1868. Although we are unsure of the exact reason for enrollment decrease, NTU has been contending with various issues that contribute to student withdrawals and stop outs. NTU has limited student housing on campus so students who are unable to find housing usually drop out and fail to re-enroll subsequent semesters. Also, some students may "stop-out" to earn an income before returning to complete their programs. Some students who have been placed on academic probation have withdrawn as well as students who have accrued high student bills and are unable to pay. Also, no new students were admitted to the associate degree program for the 2015-2016 academic year due to the program losing several faculty members.
